#### Tennessee Agriculture

- Number of Farms: 69,983
- Average Farm Size: 155 acres
- Total farmland:10.8 million acres
- Tennessee has 40,097 women farmers (35% ag producers in TN)
- Average Age of Female producers was 57.3 and males 58.4. Overall state average is 58.
- Approximately 80 percent of the land is used for agriculture purposes including forestry
